# House Bill Descriptions

## 1.) HB 233

**Homicide of an Unborn Quick Child:** The death of an unborn child under previous law was considered manslaughter. Under this bill the willful killing of an unborn child by a fatal injury to the mother is considered in the same manner as the mother was killed (i.e. if the injury to the mother is considered murder in the 1st degree, the death of the unborn child would also be considered murder in the 1st degree).

*Supported – House and Senate Passed*

## 2.) HB 157

**Road Rage Reduction Act:** Expresses the Legislature’s intent “to decrease the incidence of drivers interfering with the movement of traffic, to reduce road rage and aggressive driving, to minimize crashes, and to promote the orderly, free flowing of traffic on the roads and highways.

*Supported – House Passed*

## 3.) HB 701 – Amendment on 2nd Reading

**Artificially Provided Sustenance and Hydration:** An amendment was offered on second reading to strengthen this bill by requiring clear and convincing evidence for the withholding or withdrawing of artificially provided sustenance and hydration from a person by certain authorities making health care decisions.

*Supported – House Passed*

## 4.) HB 701 – Final Passage

**Artificially Provided Sustenance and Hydration:** Final passing of the bill related to excluding certain authorities from making health care decisions that involve withholding or withdrawing artificially provided sustenance and hydration and prohibiting the withholding or withdrawing of artificially provided sustenance or hydration from a person in a persistent vegetative state in specific circumstances.

*Supported – House Passed*

## 5.) HB 963 – Amendment on 2nd Reading

**Repeal of Annual Intangible Personal Property Tax:** An amendment was offered on second reading in an attempt to undo the repeals provisions regarding annual intangible personal property.

*Opposed – House Defeated*

## 6.) HB 963 – Amendment on 3rd Reading

**Repeal of Annual Intangible Personal Property Tax:** A “strike all” amendment was offered on third reading in an attempt to undo the repeals provisions regarding annual intangible personal property by rewording the entire bill.

*Opposed – House Defeated*

## 7.) HB 963 – Final Passage

**Repeal of Annual Intangible Personal Property Tax:** Repeals provisions regarding annual intangible personal property tax; provides additional legislative intent regarding said tax; amends provisions to conform to repeal of said tax.

*Supported – House Passed*

## 8.) HB 1041 – 3rd Reading prior to Senate sending it back to the House

**Women’s Health and Safety Act:** Raises standards in abortion clinics and revises requirements for rules of AHCA regarding abortion clinics performing abortions after first trimester of pregnancy; requires rules that prescribe standards for physical facilities, supplies & equipment, personnel, screening & evaluation, abortion procedure, recovery, follow-up care, & incident reporting; provides that rules regulating abortion clinics may not impose unconstitutional burden, etc.

*Supported – House Passed*

## 9.) HB 1041 – Final Passage

**Women’s Health and Safety Act:** Raises standards in abortion clinics and revises requirements for rules of AHCA regarding abortion clinics performing abortions after first trimester of pregnancy; requires rules that prescribe standards for physical facilities, supplies & equipment, personnel, screening & evaluation, abortion procedure, recovery, follow-up care, & incident reporting; provides that rules regulating abortion clinics may not impose unconstitutional burden, etc.

*Supported – House and Senate Passed*

## 10.) HB 1659 – Amendment on 3rd Reading

**Parental Notice of a Minor’s Abortion:** A “strike all” amendment was offered on third reading in an attempt to reword the entire bill and weaken its effects.

*Opposed – House Defeated*

## 11.) HB 1659 – 3rd Reading prior to Senate sending it back to the House

**Parental Notice of a Minor’s Abortion:** Prohibits the performing or inducement of a termination of pregnancy upon a minor without specified notice.

*Supported – House Passed*

## 12.) HB 1659 – Final Passage

**Parental Notice of a Minor’s Abortion:** Prohibits the performing or inducement of a termination of pregnancy upon a minor without specified notice.

*Supported – House and Senate Passed*

## 13.) SB 1348

**Indoor Smoking Places:** Redefines term “stand-alone bar” to include licensed premises that derives no more than specified amount of gross revenue from sale of food consumed on licensed premises & that is located in building individually listed in National Register of Historic Places; authorizes law enforcement officer to issue citation to person who violates Florida Clean Indoor Air Act; provides requirements for citation.

*Opposed – House and Senate Passed; Vetoed by Governor*

## 14.) HB 1901 – Amendment on 2nd Reading

**Slot Machines / Pari-mutuel Wagering:** An amendment to this bill was offered on second reading to weaken the legislation that would have only provided educational funding for the school district in which the slot machine was located, rather than the promised funds for education statewide.

*Opposed – House Defeated*

**1.) HB 101 Tax Holiday on Sales, Use, and Other Transactions:** Specifies a period during which the sale of books, clothing, and school supplies are exempt from such tax; provides definitions; provides exceptions; authorizes the Department of Revenue to adopt rules; provides an appropriation. *Supported – House and Senate Passed*

**2.) HB 181 Pari-mutuel Permit holders:** Licensed pari-mutuel permit holders are authorized to conduct inter-track wagering under specified conditions. The term “inter-track wagering” (ITW) means wagering on events broadcast between pari-mutuel facilities located within the state, including the rebroadcast of a simulcast signal. Current law requires a jai alai permit holder to operate a full schedule of live jai alai performances in order to participate in inter-track wagering. This bill reduces the number of required live performances that constitute a full schedule from 100 to 40. *Opposed – Senate Passed, Made law without Governor’s signature*

**3.) HB 233 Homicide of an Unborn Quick Child:** The death of an unborn child under previous law was considered manslaughter. Under this bill the willful killing of an unborn child by a fatal injury to the mother is considered in the same manner as the mother was killed (i.e. if the injury to the mother is considered murder in the 1st degree, the death of the unborn child would also be considered murder in the 1st degree). *Supported – House and Senate Passed*

**4.) HB 319 Freedom to Worship Safely Act:** Provides for the upgrading of the degree of an offense that involves the use or threat of physical force or violence if the offense is committed on the property of a religious institution while the victim is on the property for the purpose of participating in or attending a religious service; provides for severity ranking of offenses. *Supported – House and Senate Passed*

**5.) SB 730 Prohibition on Prostitution:** Redefines “lewdness” under s. 796.07, Florida Statutes, to mean any indecent or obscene act committed in the presence of any person, including a law enforcement officer. This redefinition would allow a law enforcement officer, in his or her official capacity, to arrest someone under s. 796.07, F.S., based upon the officer witnessing the alleged offending activity, rather than being required to have an independent witness who was offended by the alleged indecent or obscene act. *Supported – House and Senate Passed*

**6.) SB 732 – Committee Votes Road Rage Reduction Act:** Expresses the Legislature’s intent “to decrease the incidence of drivers interfering with the movement of traffic, to reduce road rage and aggressive driving, to minimize crashes, and to promote the orderly, free flowing of traffic on the roads and highways. *Supported in Committees – Senate Committee Passed*

**7.) SB 804 – Amendment on 2nd Reading Artificially Provided Sustenance:** An amendment was offered on second reading to strengthen this bill by requiring clear and convincing evidence for the withholding or withdrawing of artificially provided sustenance and hydration from a person by certain authorities making health care decisions. *Supported – Failed*

**8.) SB 804 – Final Passage Artificially Provided Sustenance:** This bill prohibits the suspension of artificially provided sustenance or hydration from a person in a persistent vegetative state in the following situation: (1) suspension is only for the purpose of ending life, (2) a conflict exists regarding suspension between certain parties statutorily delineated as potential proxies, and (3) No written living will, advance directive, or designation of surrogate authorizing suspension of life-prolonging procedures exists. *Supported – Failed*

**9.) HB 1041 Women’s Health and Safety Act:** Raises standards in abortion clinics and revises requirements for rules of AHCA regarding abortion clinics performing abortions after first trimester of pregnancy; requires rules that prescribe standards for physical facilities, supplies & equipment, personnel, screening & evaluation, abortion procedure, recovery, follow-up care, & incident reporting; provides that rules regulating abortion clinics may not impose unconstitutional burden, etc. *Supported – House and Senate Passed*

**10.) SB1174 – Committee Votes Slot Machine Gaming / Pari-mutuel Wagering:** Authorizes slot machines & slot machine gaming within certain pari-mutuel facilities located in Miami-Dade & Broward Counties upon approval by local referendum; clarifies authority of local law enforcement agencies; provides for local supplemental tax; provides compulsive gambling treatment program. *Opposed – Senate Passed*

**11.) SB1348 Indoor Smoking Places:** Redefines term “stand-alone bar” to include licensed premises that derives no more than specified amount of gross revenue from sale of food consumed on licensed premises & that is located in building individually listed in National Register of Historic Places; authorizes law

enforcement officer to issue citation to person who violates Florida Clean Indoor Air Act; provides requirements for citation. *Opposed – House and Senate Passed; Vetoed by Governor*

**12.) SB1354 Sexual Offenders:** This bill seeks to establish more protection for children when they are in supervised contact with sexual offenders whose victims were under the age of 18. Stricter standards for supervised visits require that a “qualified practitioner” must complete a risk assessment and safety plan and actually recommend that the supervised visit occur. *Supported – House and Senate Passed*

**13.) HB1659 Parental Notice of a Minor’s Abortion:** Prohibits the performing or inducement of a termination of pregnancy upon a minor without specified notice. *Supported – House and Senate Passed*

**14.) SB1862 – Amendment on 2nd Reading Women’s Health and Safety Act:** This amendment offered on the Senate version of the Women’s Health and Safety Act was offered to weaken the language regarding the Abortion Clinic Medical Director’s admitting privileges at a local hospital to merely a “transfer agreement” with a local hospital. *Opposed – Senate Defeated*

**15.) HB1901 Slot Machines / Pari-mutuel Wagering: Keep the Promise Act of 2005;** authorizes slot machines & slot machine gaming within certain pari-mutuel facilities located in Miami-Dade & Broward Counties upon approval by local referendum; prohibits licensees or any entity conducting business on or within licensed slot operation from employing employees of certain law enforcement or regulatory agencies. *Opposed – Senate Passed*

**16.)
