House Bill Descriptions

1 = House Bill 701: Sustenance and Hydration for the Disabled (2005) - (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Pro-life bill to prevent the removal of food and water from mentally disabled individuals including Terri Schiavo. (This bill passed the Florida House and was defeated in the Florida Senate)

2 = House Bill 1041: Women's Health and Safety Act (2005) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Pro-life bill with the intent of raising the standards for medical care in abortion clinics to be equal with other surgical treatment facilities. (This bill passed both chambers and was signed into Florida law)

3 = Weakening Amendment to House Bill 1659: Parental Notice of a Minor's Abortion (2005)
(Amendment was Opposed by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Amendment to pro-life bill that would weaken the proposed bill to allow a parent to be notified prior to their minor daughter getting an abortion. (This bill passed both chambers and is now law in Florida)

4 = PCB 1: Proposed Committee Bill in the Business Regulation Committee to Repeal the Slot Machines from Consideration in Miami-Dade County (2006) - (Supported by the CC of Florida)
Anti-gambling proposed resolution to repeal the provision for local referenda to be held in Miami-Dade County for the purpose of voting to implement slot machines at existing pari-mutuel facilities. (This proposal was blocked from making it out of its first committee of reference)

5 = House Bill 135: Charter Schools (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Education bill that establishes the Florida Schools of Excellence Commission as a charter school authorizing entity; provides powers and duties of the commission, including serving as a sponsor of charter schools, approving certain entities to act as cosponsors, approving or denying applications for Florida Schools of Excellence (FSE) charter schools, and developing standards for and evaluating the performance of cosponsors and charter schools, etc. (This bill passed both chamber and is now law in the state of Florida)

6 = House Bill 209: Repeal of the Intangible Tax (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Anti-tax bill preventing saved monies that have been previously taxed from being taxed annually by the intangible personal property tax. (This bill passed both chambers and is law)

7 = House Joint Resolution 447: Class Size and 65% of School Funding to be used for Classroom Instruction (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Education appropriation plan to be sent to the voters on the next general election ballot that also included a class size reduction requirement plan to be implemented. (This was passed by the Florida House of Representatives but died in the Florida Senate)

8 = House Bill 746: Certificate of Birth Ending in Stillbirth for Parents of Stillborn Children (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Pro-life bill that creates "Katherine's Law"; authorizes State Registrar of Vital Statistics Office of the Dept. of Health to receive electronically the certificate of death or fetal death which is required to be filed with local registrar; requires DOH to issue certificate of birth resulting in stillbirth upon request of specified parent. (This bill is now law)

9 = House Bill 1123: Government Accountability Act (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Fiscal accountability bill that provides check and balance to government use of tax payer dollars. It authorizes the Legislature to create one or more Legislative Sunset Advisory Committees; provides a schedule for abolishing state agencies and advisory committees; provides for the abolition of state agencies under certain circumstances; provides requirements for certain legislative budget requests; provides requirements with respect to performance measures and standards identified as part of long-range program plans, etc. (This bill passed both chambers and was signed into law)

10 = House Bill 1145: Official State Motto Designated as "In God We Trust" (2006) - (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Designates an official state motto as "In God We Trust" along with two other state designations. (This bill passed both chambers and was signed into law)

11 = House Joint Resolution 7037: Two-Thirds Vote for Amendment Increasing State Tax of Fee or Resulting in Significant State Spending (2006) - (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Proposes an amendment to s. 7, Art. XI of the State Constitution to require a proposed amendment or revision to the State Constitution that increases an existing state tax or fee to be approved by at least two-thirds of those voters voting in the election in which the amendment or revision is considered; defines the term "existing state tax or fee" to mean any tax or fee that produces revenue to state government; requires that a proposed amendment or revision to the State Constitution that would result in significant additional spending by state government must be approved by at least two-thirds of those voters voting in the election in which the amendment or revision is considered; defines the term "significant additional spending" to mean additional spending in any state fiscal year prior to and including the first state fiscal year of full implementation, in an amount greater than one-tenth of one percent of the total state budget, as established in the General Appropriations Act approved by the Governor, for the state fiscal year ending in the year prior to the election in which such proposed amendment or revision is considered; specifies that the determination of whether a proposed amendment or revision would result in significant additional spending by state government would be made and certified in accordance with general law. (This joint resolution passed the Florida House of Representatives but died in the Florida Senate)

12 = House Bill 7041: John McKay Scholarship Accountability (2006) - (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Education bill related to scholarships for students with disabilities; revises and adds eligibility requirements; revises and adds obligations of school districts, the Department of Education, the Commissioner of Education, nonprofit scholarship-funding organization, parents, and students. (This bill passed the House and died in the Senate)

13 = House Joint Resolution 7143: Rules of Construction (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
Resolution to be placed before the voters relating to the constitution of the state of Florida and the legislative power to legislate (it is therefore the job of the Legislature to make laws and not another branch of government). (This bill was passed by the Florida House but died in the Florida Senate and therefore will not be November ballot)

14 = House Bill 7183: Tax Exempt Biblical Display (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
This bill would allow the Holy Land Experience in Orlando to be tax exempt in Florida. (This bill passed both chambers and is law)

Descriptions of the Bills in the Senate:

1 = Senate Bill 804: Sustenance and Hydration for the Disabled (2005) - (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Pro-life bill to prevent the removal of food and water from mentally disabled individuals including Terri Schiavo. (This bill was defeated in the Florida Senate)

2 = House Bill 1041: Women's Health and Safety Act (2005) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Pro-life bill with the intent of raising the standards for medical care in abortion clinics to be par with other surgical treatment facilities. (This bill passed both chambers and was signed into Florida law)

3 = House Bill 1659: Parental Notice of a Minor's Abortion (2005) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Pro-life bill that will allow a parent to be notified prior to their minor daughter getting an abortion. (This bill passed both chambers and is now law in the state of Florida)

4 = House Bill 1901: Implementing Slot Machines in Pari-mutuels Facilities in South Florida (2005) (Opposed by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Gambling bill which implements the addition of slot machines to pari-mutuels. (This bill was carried over into a special session)

5 = House Bill 209: Repeal of the Intangible Tax (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Anti-tax bill preventing saved monies that have been previously taxed from being taxed annually. (This bill passed both chambers and is law)

6 = Senate Bill 250: Prosecution of Human Trafficking (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Pro-family bill related to the criminal activities of prostitution rings set up with migrant workers. (This bill passed both chambers and is law)

7 = Senate Bill 640: Prosecution of Luring or Enticing a Child (2006) - (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Pro-family bill relating to the criminal activities of child predators and sex offenders. (This bill passed both chambers and is law)

8 = Senate Joint Resolution 1150: Class Size and 65% of School Funding to be used for Classroom Instruction (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Education appropriation plan to be sent to the voters on the next general election ballot. (This was killed in the Florida Senate)

9 = Senate Joint Resolution 1158: Limitation on State Appropriation Increases (2006) - (Supported by CC of Florida)
 Anti-tax plan to be sent to the voters on the next general election ballot to prevent large spending increases being added to the budget without the voters' opinion. (This was killed in the Florida Senate)

10 = Senate Joint Resolution 2170: Repeal of the Anti-Catholic (Blaine) Amendment in the Florida Constitution (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Effort to preserve religious schools, hospitals, etc. receiving public monies from the state of Florida. (This was killed in the FL Senate)

11 = Motion to Reconsider Senate Joint Resolution 2170: Repeal of the Anti-Catholic (Blaine) Amendment in the Constitution (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 Effort to revive the plan to preserve certain funding for religious schools, hospitals, etc. (Session ended before action was taken)

12 = Senate Bill 2234: School Choice (Vouchers) Scholarship Program (2006) - (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 This bill is a legislative fix for the education scholarship programs that are being questioned by the judiciary. (This bill passed the Florida Senate and died in messages)

13 = Senate Bill 2406: Corporate Income Tax Trust Fund (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 This bill is an attempt to restore a school voucher program that was ruled unconstitutional by establishing a private donation funding stream for the program. (Senate passed it and it died in messages)

14 = House Bill 7183: Tax Exempt Biblical Display (2006) (Supported by the Christian Coalition of Florida)
 This bill would allow the Holy Land Experience in Orlando to be tax exempt in Florida. (This bill passed both chambers and is law)
