



Devotion Guidelines:

1. Keep it short and interactive
2. Read the Scripture passage together with each person reading a verse
3. Ask questions about each verse
4. Ask each child how they will apply what they have learned from the verses. (Even your young children) You, as a parent, also share what you will apply. Remember that Bible study is for application and transformation not just for information.)
5. Pray together as a family (You and your children can take turns praying)
  - For each other's requests
  - To ask for God's help to apply what you have learned

**Read Together:**

**2 Corinthians 5:9-10** *"9So we make it our goal to please Him, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. 10For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each of us may receive what is due for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad."*

**Joshua 1:8** *"8This book of the law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it; for then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have success."*

**Talk Together:**

1. According to 2 Corinthians 5:9, what should our goal in life be?
2. Why is it important?
3. In what areas of our life should we please God?
4. In Joshua 1:8, how does God define what is true success for us?

**Conviction:**

God wants me to become successful and my goal is to pursue success God's way.

**Application:**

What are the things I should do to become successful in God's eyes?

**Pray Together:**

Dear Father, thank You for setting in your hearts a desire to be happy and successful. Help us to understand the true meaning of success and have goals that will please you. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.



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
