more to lose than to gain. But God wants us to obey — even if we believe that His

commandments are irrational, illogical or unjust. God commands us to obey by faith.

What are some of the things that God has commanded that we have difficulties with?

- Forgiving others especially if we feel that we have been wronged
- 2. Submitting to authority at work, submitting to our husbands
- 3. To be more loving, more encouraging towards our spouses
- 4. To be more respectful and honoring to our parents
- 5. To tithe, to share our blessings

God does not give us these commands in order to make it difficult for us. He gives us

These commands so that we can become better persons. By commanding us to obey Him, He is giving us the basis for which we can revolve our lives around. The principles by which we can live by. He is in fact giving us a means by which we can please Him. When we obey God, we take the way of wisdom because His blessings for obedience far outweigh any possible consequences of not conforming to the world.

Partial Obedience is disobedience

Delayed obedience is disobedience.

What are some things that can hinder us from obeying God?

- 1. Lack of intimacy with God
- 2. Having other gods such as
 - A. money
 - B. self
 - C. other people
 - D. power

Often times, we opt to compromise in our obedience. But we must remember that God will not bend down to us to please our compromises, rather it is us who must reach out to Him to partake in His Holiness.

God commands us to obey Him in **everything**. To be discipled is a commandment and we are required to obey.

In Matthew 10:35-39 and in Luke 14:26, Jesus challenges us by Raising the bar. He wants us to be set apart even from our own family, set apart by loving God above everything. Our love for God must be so great that it would look like our love for our family is hatred. This means that our love for God should surpass even our love for our own family.

- Supreme love for God is about pleasing God. . . Pleasing God by OBEYING all his commandments.
- The sad truth is that we don't always obey God. Often only obeying when it is convenient to us.
 Obeying on our own terms and conditions.
- * We do this because we do not understand His kind of love.
- When a person understand his sinfulness and God's holiness . . . And how God's loving solution can overcome that sinfulness this will result in a tremendous gratitude and a supreme love for God.

To understand God's love, we have to look at it in three aspects:

- 1. anthropology Man's sinfulness and its consequence which is death
- 2. Soteriology man's need for salvation from sin
- 3. Christology—man's only salvation: JESUS CHRIST

It is selfless and unconditional.

This is how we must love God — selflessly and unconditionally.

- Pursuing intimacy with God delights God. And when God is delighted with us, we will experience His presence in our life.
- * In His presence, we are protected and provided for thus making us distinguished. Setting us apart for His purpose.
- * His purpose for us is Relationship. A relationship with Him and a relationship with others who also have been distinguished and set apart. This is Friendship with a Vision.
- * DISCIPLESHIP is our marching order. To be disciple and to disciple.
- * What is discipleship? It is the process of bringing people to Jesus Christ (BELIEVE) and building them up (GROW) in the faith towards Christlikeness (DISCIPLE), for the purpose of spiritual multiplication (MULTIPLY) resulting in the glory of God.

Works

Heart Check: In John 21, we hear Jesus asking Peter if he loves Him. He is now asking us. . . .

Your name , do you love Me? Your name do you love Me more than these? And He asks for the third time Your name, do you love Me?

Jesus commands us to love God with all of heart, with all our soul, with all our mind and with all our strength. What does this mean?

To love God with all our heart is to make Him our **first love**. The heart being the very center of life, controls us. So whatever is in our heart controls us. Jesus is asking us to put Him in the very center of our life, to allow Him to be in control.

To love God with our soul is to find ways to have a deep and personal relationship with Him. To make Him our **real love**. Jesus is asking us to really be fully engaged with Him, so that our love for Him will overcome our love for the world.

To love God with all our mind is to make Him our **true love.** To have a knowledge and understanding of who He is and His ways. He wants us to love Him not with just our emotions but with our intellect as well. Jesus is asking us to surrender our plans to Him and align ourselves to His will.

To love God with all our strength is to give Him **full love.** Full love is an expression of total surrender and abandonment and of trust. To give Him our heart, our soul, our mind. . . Our life experiences, our struggles, our pains. . . Everything that is in us. . . To surrender to Him in OBEDIENCE because we are grateful for His love. To love Him in AGAPE, as He has loved us. To allow ourselves to be molded and trimmed through His word, through discipleship as we fulfill His marching order in the Great Commandment. To allow ourselves to become instruments of His blessings and His love to those who do not yet know Him.
