The Beginning of the Christian Church

The Book of Acts records the first 30 years of history of the Christian church beginning in the ascension of Jesus up until when the gospel spread and the church grew from Jerusalem to Judea, Samaria and up to Rome.

The Last Words of Jesus

Before His ascension, Jesus told His disciples:

"...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth." (Acts 1:8-9)

His last words were intended to be left ringing in the ears of His disciples, and to be passed on to the coming generations. Jesus essentially spoke about three things in His last words.

1. Power

Peter, who denied Jesus three times (Matthew 26:33-35), and the rest of the disciples who fled and hid for fear of the Jews were both ashamed and disheartened about what they did. Jesus knew they needed His power to be able to spread the gospel and that is what He promised to give them.

There are two dimensions to this power: the power by ability and power by authority.

Power by ability comes from the Greek word "dunamis" where the English words dynamite, dynamic, dynamism came from. This power comes from sheer energy and force.

Power by authority comes from the Greek word "exusia" (Matthew 28:18-20). This is the power which men and women in uniform or in positions like the policemen or the Queen of England have. They don't always have the dynamic power but their power comes from their inherent authority.

Ability without authority can be dangerous while authority without ability can be pathetic. Jesus has both. Both were given to the disciples as well when the Holy Spirit came upon them.

2. Purpose

The result of power is purpose. When the Holy Spirit lives in us, our purpose is to become witnesses of Jesus. Peter and John, filled with the Holy Spirit, boldly witnessed in the name of Jesus. When the crowd saw this and realized that they were unschooled and ordinary men they were amazed. They noted that they had been with Jesus (Acts 4:13).

This is also true in our life today. As we witness for Jesus, the difference in our lives can only be credited to the fact that we have Him and that He lives in us. Our responses, our appearance, behavior, and disposition, tell others about our relationship with Jesus.

3. Process

The mission plan was to start in Jerusalem then to bring the gospel to Judea and then Samaria and to the ends of the earth. Jerusalem was for most of them, a place of failure, where Peter denied Jesus three times; where one of them had committed suicide; where they all had fled and hid out of fear.

It could have been easier for them to start somewhere else where nobody knew them and where they could start clean. But Jesus told them to start there so that people would see the difference in what they can become when they receive power from the Holy Spirit.

Our witness is most powerful where the people know who we were: with our weaknesses, our sins, our brokenness – then they would see the saving and transforming power of Jesus who now lives in us.

Our "Jerusalem" (where we are) is just the starting point. We are to carry out the mission to our nearest reach (Judea) and to intentionally cross over cultural, racial, sect boundaries where people may not like us or disagree with us (Samaria) and all the way to the ends of the earth.

Jesus' last words to His disciples are also meant for us Christians today. We owe the next generations the passing on and the spreading of the gospel as present day disciples and witnesses of Jesus.

We cannot effectively serve God or live our Christian life by our own strength. Just as a glove is motionless without a hand wearing it, we are powerless without the Holy Spirit. He will enable us to live life as true and effective witnesses of God to the people watching us
