

### Devotion Guidelines:

- 1. Keep it short and interactive
- 2. Read the Scripture passage together with each person reading a verse
- 3. Ask questions about each verse
- 4. Ask each child how they will apply what they have learned from the verses. (Even your young children) You, as a parent, also share what you will apply. Remember that Bible study is for application and transformation not just for information.)
- 5. Pray together as a family (You and your children can take turns praying)
  - For each other's requests
- To ask for God's help to apply what you have learned

### Read Together:

Haggai 2:11-19 ""Thus says the Lord of hosts, 'Ask now the priests for a ruling: 12 If a man carries holy meat in the fold of his garment, and touches bread with this fold, or cooked food, wine, oil, or any other food, will it become holy?" And the priests answered, "No." <sup>13</sup> Then Haggai said, "If one who is unclean from a corpse touches any of these, will the latter become unclean?" And the priests answered, "It will become unclean." 14 Then Haggai said, "So is this people. And so is this nation before Me,' declares the Lord, 'and so is every work of their hands; and what they offer there is unclean. <sup>15</sup> But now, do consider from this day onward: before one stone was placed on another in the temple of the Lord, <sup>16</sup> from that time when one came to a grain heap of twenty measures, there would be only ten; and when one came to the wine vat to draw fifty measures, there would be only twenty. <sup>17</sup>I smote you and every work of your hands with blasting wind, mildew and hail; yet you did not come back to Me,' declares the Lord. 18 'Do consider from this day onward, from the twenty-fourth day of the ninth month; from the day when the temple of the Lord was founded, consider: <sup>19</sup> Is the seed still in the barn? Even including the vine, the fig tree, the pomegranate and the olive tree, it has not borne fruit. Yet from this day on I will bless you." 1 Corinthians 3:16-17 "16 Do you not know that you are a temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? <sup>17</sup> If any man destroys the temple of God, God will destroy him, for the temple of God is holy, and that is what you are."

# Talk Together:

- 1. What were the two questions God used as an illustration found in verses 11-13? What does that teach us about sin and holiness? What does it teach us about our outward work (doing) and inward state of our hearts (being) as found in verse 14?
- 2. What then did God want the people to consider based on verses 15 & 18? In verses 18-19, what was God's promise as He instructed them?
- 3. In 1 Corinthians 3:16-17, Paul tells us that we are the temple of God and we are to be holy. Knowing this, what will we do to live as God's temple?

#### Conviction:

Knowing that my body is the temple of God and that He dwells in me, I will live in such a way that my thoughts, words, and actions always prioritize God.

# Application:

What aspects of my life do I need to reconsider to have a life that honors and glorifies God?

### Pray Together:

Heavenly Father, thank You for the wonderful privilege of being Your temple. Teach us to live a life that prioritizes You in all that we do. Help us to choose our actions and guide our thoughts so that everything we do will give glory to You. In Jesus' Name we pray, Amen.



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
