

Devotion Guidelines: 1. Keep it short and interactive

2. Read the Scripture passage together with each person reading a verse 3. Ask guestions about each verse

4. Ask each child how they will apply what they have learned from the verses. (Even your young children) You, as a parent, also share what you will apply. Remember that Bible study is for application and transformation not just for information.)

- 5. Pray together as a family (You and your children can take turns praying) - For each other's requests
- To ask for God's help to apply what you have learned

Read Together:

Deuteronomy 7:9⁹ Know therefore that the Lord your God, He is God, the faithful God, who keeps His covenant and His lovingkindness to a thousandth generation with those who love Him and keep His commandments;

Matthew 5:37 ^{3...} But let your statement be, 'Yes, yes' or 'No, no'; anything beyond these is of evil.

Matthew 12:36 ³⁶ But I tell you that every careless word that people speak, they shall give an accounting for it in the day of judgment.

Talk Together:

- 1. What does Deuteronomy 7:9 tell us about the character of God?
- 2. Based on the verses in Matthew, how then should we treat our words and our commitment to others?
- 3. Why do you think it is important for us to be truthful and keep our words?

Conviction:

I will grow in the area of being truthful and in keeping my words. I will say things as I really mean it and be mindful of saying things that I don't really mean.

Application:

In what ways will you practice truthfulness in your words?

Pray Together:

Heavenly Father, we praise You for You are a God who doesn't lie and that you are faithful in keeping Your words. As your children, help us to do the same – to honor our commitments and to always be truthful. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



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
