DEVOTION GUIDELINES

1. Keep it short and interactive.
2. Read the Scripture passage together.

4. Pray for each other and ask for God's help to apply what you have learned.

READ TOGETHER.

Acts 20:17-38

Acts 20:18-19 ¹⁸ And when they (elders) had come to him (Paul), he said to them, “You yourselves know, from the first day that I set foot in Asia, how I was with you the whole time, ¹⁹ serving the Lord with all humility and with tears and with trials which came upon me through the plots of the Jews;

Acts 20:20-21 ²⁰ how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you publicly and from house to house, ²¹ solemnly testifying to both Jews and Greeks of repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Acts 20:22-23 ²² And now, behold, bound by the Spirit, I am on my way to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there, ²³ except that the Holy Spirit solemnly testifies to me in every city, saying that bonds and afflictions await me.

Acts 20:28 Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood.

TALK TOGETHER.

1. How would you describe Paul in verse 18? How did he show that he was intentional?
2. What are the things he modeled based on verse 19? How about in verses 20 and 21?
3. In verse 22, what does it mean for Paul to be bound by the Spirit?
4. In verse 28, what is his message to the elders to prepare them for the future? What must they do?

CONVICTION

I will live intentionally so I can be a blessing to others.

APPLICATION

Like Paul, how can you be more intentional in your relationships?
