READ TOGETHER - ACTS 28

Acts 28:13-15 13...on the following day we reached Puteoli. 14 There we found some brethren and were invited to stay with them for seven days; and thus, we came to Rome. 15 And the brethren, when they heard about us, came from there as far as the Market of Appius and Three Inns to meet us; and when Paul saw them, he thanked God and took courage. ¹⁶ When we got to Rome, Paul was allowed to live by himself, with a soldier to guard him.

Acts 28:23-24 23 When they had set a day for Paul, they came to him at his lodging in large numbers; and he was explaining to them by solemnly testifying about the kingdom of God and trying to persuade them concerning Jesus, from both the Law of Moses and from the Prophets, from morning until evening. ²⁴ Some were being persuaded by the things spoken, but others would not believe.

Acts 28:30-31 30 And he staved two full years in his own rented quarters and was welcoming all who came to him, 31 preaching the kingdom of God and teaching concerning the Lord Jesus Christ with all openness, unhindered.
